January Minutes: Approved 8-0

Public Comment: None

<u>President</u> (Burgess): Healthy program so far, great turnout at 1st race of Women's Series (Bariani). NorCal Women's teams will be participating at May 11 Tour of California race. At least two officials needed for same.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Rosefield): Simple: \$1517 in checking, \$64,191 in savings. We are where we should be.

Committees:

Officials (Franklin): Caravan Training – Eva Ben Hora doing caravan training (com, 2 motors, 3 follows). **Proposal** (Burgess, Fisher): For Sea Otter and Wente, NCNCA to support mini-caravan training, at a cost of \$300-\$400. **Approved** 7-0-1. Full race – 1^{st} race of Premiere Series. Lapcards needed. Ken Kimari's officials' pay review. Barry Orlando is working with new officials. Jim Dosenbach has joined committee. Competition (Franklin): no report

Mentors (Soto): Races are being covered.

<u>Women</u> (Burgess for Hill): Women's Budget Authorization (to new business). Discussion on how to encourage Race Directors to offer equitable prizes for W4 and other fields. Women's Series Rules approved and posted, first race successful.

<u>Other Committees</u>: No reports for Juniors, Banquet, Safety, Scheduling, Policy & Procedures, Membership, Promoters.

Old Business:

<u>Championships</u>: Challenge Challenge Road Race remains Elite Road Championships (Pescadero request turned down as late).

Meeting Locations: returning to Marriott Courtyard – Livermore – for April meeting?

New Business:

Cyclocross Discussion:

Problems with getting Nor Cal events into the USAC program, or getting USAC to use other than USAC events in determining start positions for National Championships.

Bringing promoters into USAC: Difficulties: \$3 rider insurance surcharges per rider. Higher permit and license fees, \$15 one-day fees for unlicensed riders. Suggestions for USAC to encourage promoters: USAC to have licenses go to January 31 (to cover late season races). USAC 'cross numbers are up; other income is flat. Use a time trial at Nationals to determine start order/call ups. Reduce surcharges and/or one-day fees for cyclocross.

Proposal: (Leibold, Franklin) NCNCA to institute Cyclocross Committee to come up with ways to reduce barriers for promoters to put on USAC cyclocross events. Approved 8-0. (DeFiebre to be BOD liaison, members: Burgess, Rosefield, Robert Leibold, Tom Simpson.

Tom Simpson ideas: USAC ombudsman (s) for getting/retaining courses; NCNCA supplied creditability package for cities/agencies to present the sport. Issues that keep races from coming to USAC: license structure, single day fees, insults, not enough team support to Worlds. Junior Development Camp proposal

Grants: \$100 units for those who register and are selected, with requirements. **Proposal**: (Burgess, Hardaway) earmark \$1,000 out of Development Budget for Junior Development Camp grants.

Approved 8-0. Proposed guidelines to be sent to BOD 10 days before next meeting from Juniors Committee for consideration.

<u>Women's Budget 2014</u> **Proposal** to accept budget (Burgess, Rosefield) **Approved** 8-0. Scoring of Women's Series to be done by Ken Hernandez, paid for by Women's Committee.

<u>Non-Emergency Voting Procedures</u> (Hardaway): Would like to bring proposals of non-emergency issues to Board 30 days ahead of vote. **Tabled** 8-0.
